New Boca Pointe fire station will cut emergency response time

Palm Beach County Commissioners have given unanimous approval to the construction of a new fire station in West Boca Raton designed to cut response time to a growing suburban area.

Following a public hearing on Thursday, commissioners approved a development order amendment designating 1.84 acres of land at the northeast corner of Boca Pointe for a single-bay fire station. "This will reduce response time dramatically," said Commissioner Mary McCarty. She said it should cut the current wait of seven to eight minutes for fire
